Mission Statement:

To develop and enhance today's wildland firefighters with the skills, knowledge and abilities to perform as tomorrow's competent and effective leaders.



The Apprenticeship Program's formal headquarters are at the Wildland Fire Training and Conference Center located at McClellan, California just north of I-80 in the Sacramento area.



The Program:

The Program is designed to take an entry level wildland firefighter and provide education, training and work experience that will allow individuals to develop into tomorrow's leaders.

Apprentices are required to successfully complete one or two four-week-long residential Academies, a prescribed program of Required Supplemental Technical Training and 3,000 hours of supervised on-the-job training. Upon successful completion of these requirements, an apprentice will be placed as a fully qualified Firefighter Type 1 (FFT1) within a Federal Wildland Firefighting Agency.
